HKIFF INDUSTRY UNVEILS PROJECT MARKET WINNERS, ANIMATION TAKES CENTRE STAGE



13 March 2024 (Hong Kong) – The first HKIFF Industry Project Market concluded today by awarding 21 cash and in-kind prizes worth over US\$223,000 to outstanding projects of diverse interests and genres. The big winners are two animation projects which received three awards, underscoring the growing impact and appeal of the art form in the film industry.

The Project Market this year incorporates the 22nd Hong Kong - Asia Film Financing Forum (HAF22) and the inaugural HKIFF Industry - CAA China Genre Initiative (HCG). Over the course of three days, it presented 47 projects shortlisted from more than 460 submissions representing 48 countries and regions. The event facilitated a record number of over 1,150 private business meetings, engaging filmmakers with industry professionals and potential investors.

The Excreman – On the Road by McDull creator and veteran animator Brian Tse won the IDP Award for Hong Kong projects. **Heirloom** by Upamanyu Bhattacharyya, an Indian animation feature also selected for the HAF Goes to Cannes program, won the WIP Award as a non-Hong Kong project. Both projects demonstrate lively reimaginings of local tales and a strong connection to their domestic social landscapes.





The inaugural HCG Awards were presented to two outstanding genre projects: *Call of Lobster* by Yin Chen-Hao and *Dying Fire* by Gao Linyang, for their compelling narratives and bold use of dramatic elements. The objective of the HCG, according to Mary Gu, CEO of CAA China, is to provide the next generation of filmmakers in the region with a network of support to help them launch their careers, both locally and in the international marketplace.

According to Dr Wilfred Wong, Chairman of the Hong Kong International Film Festival Society, the HKIFF Industry Project Market has provided a more robust platform for filmmakers to showcase their innovative projects and establish connections with industry players by bringing HAF and HCG under one umbrella.

"It marks a new chapter of our ongoing industry initiatives," Dr Wong stated. "We are thrilled with the response from the film community, and the exceptional quality of this year's projects fills me with hope and optimism for their future success."

Dr Wong congratulated all the winners and participants of the HKIFF Industry Project Market while acknowledging the generous support from an expanding list of sponsors, including CAA China, Aim Media, Project D, La Fonte, and INBETWEEN this year.

About HKIFF Industry Project Market

The HKIFF Industry Project Market was launched in 2024 and incorporates the well-established Hong Kong - Asia Film Financing Forum (HAF) and the newly introduced HKIFF Industry - CAA China Genre Initiative (HCG) initiative. This integration upholds HAF's objective of establishing an ecosystem to support filmmakers with projects in progress, particularly for co-production ventures. In its first edition, the HKIFF Industry Project Market showcased 35 HAF projects in development, ten HAF works-in-progress, and six HCG projects. The HKIFF Industry Project Market is being held concurrently with the Hong Kong FILMART, Asia's largest film market, regularly attracting over 8,000 industry professionals.

About Hong Kong International Film Festival Industry Office (HKIFF Industry)

To enhance the promotion and support of film industry development, the Hong Kong International Film Festival Society restructured its industry services in 2021, which led to the establishment of the Hong Kong International Film Festival Industry Office (HKIFF Industry). The HKIFF Industry provides comprehensive services and global opportunities for independent filmmakers. Through the HKIFF Industry, filmmakers can avail themselves of various services designed to enhance their projects and increase their appeal, including the HAF Film Lab, which helps refine projects for more significant impact. Additionally, filmmakers can access post-production assistance through the HKIFF Industry Project Market. Furthermore, the HKIFF Industry facilitates exposure of projects on major international platforms through the HAF Goes to Cannes initiative. Finally, the HKIFF Collection assists filmmakers in planning the trajectory of their completed films. These services collectively serve as windows to the world for independent filmmakers, opening avenues for recognition and success.

About The Hong Kong International Film Festival Society Limited (HKIFFS)

The Hong Kong International Film Festival Society Limited (HKIFFS) is a charitable, non-profit, and non-governmental organisation committed to exploring and promoting creativity in film art and culture. It is responsible for organising the renowned Hong Kong International Film Festival (HKIFF) and the Hong Kong-Asia Film Financing Forum (HAF). Another notable event organised by the society is the Cine Fan Summer International Film Festival (Summer IFF), which takes place annually in August. In 2013, HKIFF introduced the HKIFF Cine Fan Programme, a repertory programme aimed at enriching and deepening the cinematic experience of Hong Kong moviegoers. This monthly programme showcases contemporary, retrospective, and thematic films, offering diverse cinematic delights. In 2021, the HKIFFS underwent a restructuring of its film industry services and established the HKIFF Industry to promote and support the development of the non-mainstream film industry. Industry achieves this through initiatives such as co-production ventures, festival strategies, and overseas distribution efforts, all facilitated by the HKIFF Collection.
