ONE-SENTENCE SYNOPSIS

Girls create their ice rink by hand to play ice hockey in the Himalayan desert where the ice lasts six weeks, but their hope for a better life never melts away.

SYNOPSIS

In India, there are women who play out their unbridled passions on the ice. At the height of 3,500 meters, they build their ice rink manually in the brutal winter, at -20 to -30 degrees Celsius. They pour buckets of water for weeks on the bare ground until it turns into a frozen field of water; this natural ice allows skating only for six weeks. Girls in Ladakh, a sere land of high desert and remorseless sun, have been playing ice hockey for more than ten years. But in a society where women used to be excluded from sports, men still insist on their privilege to use the frozen pond, and women's teams suffer from the shortage of equipment and support. Still, the passion of the girls never melts away. They keep playing on hard ice covered with frozen weeds. They never stop teaching young kids to nurture the next generation of female players. They travel to promote skating and ice hockey among young girls in the remote villages. For them, ice hockey is something that fuels hope and transforms lives. This film follows their struggle to uplift the stature of the women in India through sports.

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

I wondered what ice hockey means to them, watching the girls pouring buckets of water in the harsh winter nights to make an ice rink. I watched them playing on sand with a coconut in the summer. They did not care whether the donated second-hand gear fits or not in the winter. They were just happy to fly on the ice freely. I saw their passion and I also noticed the social discrimination against women behind the beautiful scenery of Ladakh. Noor Jahan studies for her doctoral degree in Delhi and works as a temple mural restorer. Rinchen is a sports teacher at a local school. Kunzes works at an NGO and also is a news reader at a local TV station. They all could have easier lives if they wanted. But they always come back to the ice rink in winters to play, to teach the kids, and to keep challenging themselves to be better: "I don't feel I am less than anybody else. And ice hockey is giving me a chance to prove that." I wanted to make this sentence into a film. The women in Ladakh refuse to stop fighting to carve their names on the ice.
