#### **ONE-SENTENCE SYNOPSIS**

Things fall apart in quiet madness. Three lives and a blank milestone. Nowhere to go. All trapped in the convoluted world of phalluses and masks.

#### **SYNOPSIS**

We all live in one story. But. Different realities. Or. Perhaps. We all live in one reality. But. Different stories. And. In between. There is just a mask.

In the gloomy and remote valley of Phobjika, Central Bhutan, Sangay (16) lives with her widower father, Ap Atsara, a craftsman who specialises in making wooden phalluses. He has also been playing the role of an atsara (a clown) in the tsechu (festival) for the last twenty years. Now, he wants to retire and pass on the mask to a younger talent. But, a dark secret from the past unfolds. And in the convoluted world of phalluses and masks, Sangay struggles to find congruence between her inner world and the outer relationships. She gets lost in the haunting and beautiful landscape of Phobjikha in search of who she wants to become. Instead, she finds a mask. And behind it, her world.

#### **DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT**

In my native dialect, we "unknot" or "untie" a story. A story gives me freedom – the possibilities of both good and evil, to empathiSe without the constraints of being moral. A story first came to me as a question. I have attended many festivals in Bhutan and received blessings from the atsaras' phalluses and have always wondered what kind of a person is behind those funny red masks and weird costumes? Are the symbolism and the sanctity of the outer shell more important than the actual person inside? The film does not provide an answer but attempts to look at the humanity inside. Have our masks become our identity?

But we are also the victims of our own morals, our own ingeniously constructed morals. I live in a world that is obsessed with phallic symbols. In the film, the phallus as a symbol is a grim reminder of the presence of violence underneath the silence and stillness. It is a symbol of male chauvinism and humanity's decadence. In essence, *The Red Phallus* is about the paradox of being a human. A mother gives birth to a human, someone with boddhicitta, capable of attaining enlightenment. Then, where do we go wrong?

Tashi Gyeltshen worked as a journalist before delving into filmmaking. A self-taught filmmaker, he wrote and directed his first short, *Girl with a Red Sky* (2008), produced and commissioned by UNICEF, Bhutan. His third short, *The Red Door* (2014), premiered at International Film Festival Rotterdam, and was also an official selection at the Hong Kong International Film Festival.
