ONE-SENTENCE SYNOPSIS

In the context of contemporary high-advanced technology and totalitarianism, this film presents the predicament of global warming terms of in humanity's choices about nuclear power.

SYNOPSIS

Anchored by a man whose quest humanizes global changes, this film traces the historical events and present situation of nuclear disaster across human society. Every nuclear site he revisits represents a specific temporality — Northeast Asia as a vaguely uncertain future; Fukushima, Japan, as the ongoing present; Semipalatinsk, Kazakhstan, as the concealed past; Chernobyl, Ukraine, as the forever alienated present and Eurajoki, Finland, as the future of the future. The film unfolds from one place to another, from the remote past to the near present towards the possible future. The narrative created through deconstruction and reconstruction of histories and presents provides a new space to reflect on nuclear issues. In this space, a panorama of global apocalyptic landscapes after nuclear disaster as well as the daily lives of humans on these lands is brought to life. Between ruins and survival, history and future, daily life and apocalypse, alienation and familiarity, reality and bizarreness, the film, visually futuristic yet close to cyberpunk science fiction, seeks to create a human allegory in the present.

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

As the crystallization of highly-advanced human reason, like the opened Pandora's Box, nuclear power probably is the most severe threat that science has ever created. And the existential conundrum facing human today is to make sure of human life survives the high risks of nuclear energy. However, history has clearly revealed the harsh reality to us: when individuals' well being is at odds with the interests of the state, the fate of individuals is defined by their powerlessness. And their misery may be conveniently excluded from official writing of history and ignored henceforth.

Are nuclear bombs resonating from Northeast Asia a wake-up call for us to be aware of this issue? How are the victims of past nuclear disasters continuing with their lives? Who makes the call for human society? What should we do?

I attempt to create a present day allegory through a visual narrative of both the apocalyptic landscape and human's daily lives in those areas ruined after nuclear disasters. Hence, I holistically present how the human trajectory has been changed in the past, how it is being changed in the present and how it will be changed in the future due to our reliance on nuclear technology.

Living in Beijing since 1993, Zhao Liang has been working as an independent documentary filmmaker as well as a multimedia artist in photography and video art.
