ONE-SENTENCE SYNOPSIS

An old railway platform in a remote valley of Georgia, situated on the "New Silk Road" linking China with Europe, suddenly becomes a site for immense change.

SYNOPSIS

The scarcely populated village, languishing in poverty and solitude, suddenly becomes a battlefield for big changes. Hundreds of Chinese settle in the area to build a fast railway, which most probably will lead to abolition of an old village platform and drastic reshape of their landscape. Villagers living around the site await changes with hope and fear. The ambiguous nature of construction process and their inability to communicate with Chinese due to language and cultural barriers makes the reality even more obscure for villagers. The film follows the characters and situations that developed around the railway station for five years – till the demolition process reaches the platform itself – the only steady point in the whole area full of unpredictable changes. It all starts as a comedy but slowly turns into a drama. The situation becomes so tense that workers go on strike with no hope of efficient settlement, since parties, including high officials, cannot manage to communicate properly due to the language barrier. Miscommunication leads to subsequent tension and Chinese and villagers attack each other. Villagers start to revolt. So does nature – in the most critical moment landslides start endangering the whole project and the village itself.

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

A 5-year long observation of this remote valley in Georgia shows the drastic changes it has undergone due to the New Silk Road railway route construction. At the crossroads of Europe and Asia, in the shadow of a giant neighbour, Russia, Georgia still struggles to find its own importance and place on the world map. Therefore, the train from China to Europe is seen as something vital for the country. Beyond this global agenda, locally people are unaware of what is happening to them next. They are stuck between construction and deconstruction. For villagers, all this is an aggressive intrusion into their lives and a harmful reshaping of their landscape; for the country it means a route from China to Europe with the total absence of the Russians. The time we committed to observing one particular community gave us the unique opportunity and material to experience real changes and what they really mean to people – lives and deaths, joys and sorrows of ordinary, unnoticed but charismatic characters. To zoom in on things that are blurred from the fast trains, that fade away from a global perspective. This is what interests us.

Vano Arsenishvili – (co-director and cinematographer) studied at the Vienna Film Academy and Tbilisi Theatre and Film University. Apart from filmmaking, Vano also teaches documentary at the Caucasus Media School, GIPA and Black Sea University.
