#### **ONE-SENTENCE SYNOPSIS**

*Nomad Meets the City* is the story of one endearing family's struggle to survive and adapt in the face of the modern world's demands.

#### **SYNOPSIS**

Former herder Tumurbaatar works tirelessly as a garbage truck driver in the Mongolian capital of Ulaanbaatar, striving to better his daughter's education and to compete in the modern economy. Torn between life in the city and his home and family in a countryside town, the pressures of distance and separation take a toll. A doctor in the countryside, his wife, Tungaa, maintains her roots and helps tend the family herd, and Tumurbaatar's home visits reveal fault lines in their marriage and identities. They both speak romantically about retiring as true nomads, but she sees what he does not: his nomadic roots are already lost to the city. In spite of it all, they cling fast to dreams for their children to lead lives they cannot.

#### **DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT**

Through the human lens of the individual, this film moves beyond mere documentation to capture an emotional pulse of changing times. The transformation from traditional to modern, and rural to urban, is a shared story of the human race. To see it happening before our very eyes in a culture rooted in rural nomadism – the polar opposite of modern and urban — is truly significant. The current situation in Mongolia is often reported to outsiders through journalists employing sensationalist tactics, painting dire pictures of the city "slums" or romanticized images of nomads, catering to our secret penchant for hyperbole. Given that film is an art form with the potential to inspire, I hope to utilize it to that effect with a more thoughtful rendering. I attempt to achieve an honest portrayal of our characters on their own terms, emphasizing their individual humanity. Moreover, our characters represent a nuanced slice of Mongolian society, culturally occupying a grey area between the past and the present. Made over the course of several years in Mongolia, with an all-Mongolian production team and international partners, *Nomad Meets the City* attempts to capture a turning point in human society through a story that is both unique and universal.

Anji Sauvé Clubb holds a Master's degree in Urban Planning from Harvard University, where she also gained experience in videography, storytelling, and editing. Cumulatively, she has over fifteen years of experience living and working in East Asia, including ten years growing up in Taiwan. Her background prior to urbanism and film was in public policy and international development: she holds a BA in International Relations from Georgetown University and studied documentary filmmaking and production at Massachusetts College of Art and Design. *Nomad Meets the City* is Anji's first feature-length film.
