ONE-SENTENCE SYNOPSIS

A documentary unveils rich tastes of memory from the first meal of new settlers and further unravels the larger historical flows of a "floating city", Hong Kong.

SYNOPSIS

By recording immigrants' memories of their first meals in Hong Kong, the documentary offers a gateway to understanding these immigrants' relationships with Hong Kong.

As these speakers move along the timeline from being an "immigrant" to becoming a "local", the film aspires to record the continuous fluidity of Hong Konger identity and Hong Kong history by retrieving personal memories and thoughts of these immigrants. Propelled by the political unrest in Hong Kong in 2019, we hope to take this film further to portray the stories of Hong Kongers who have chosen to leave the city.

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

Food is an integral part of any lifestyle and a starting point to reflect on the differences and challenges these immigrants have endured in life. They came with their imagination of Hong Kong. Their first meal in Hong Kong became the first collision between reality and imagination. One by one, their dishes, embedded in memory, became the ingredients of this complex city. As the film documents changes bit by bit, and story by story, the audience will come to understand cultural imaginations of historical flows through those immigrants' stories.
