ONE-SENTENCE SYNOPSIS

The innocent friendship between two boys crosses the barriers built by religion and society, but when the relentless fate separates them, how do the boys face the first farewell?

SYNOPSIS

The aftermath of Babri Mosque demolition in India, 1992-93, found its violent echoes even at the remote village in a border district of West Bengal where the story of the film begins to unfold. A story of friendship between two little boys belongs to two warring religious communities. Palash (8) is the son of a Brahmin while Safikul (8) is the son of a Muslim weaver. The innocence of Palash and Safikul receives its sustenance from nature. The greenery of the village, the river and the vast stretch of paddy fields playfully rebound with the echoes of the voices and the laughter of the boys. However, their relentless fate arrives quietly, and separation becomes the destiny of their friendship. How the boys face the farewell and spread wings to fly again.

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

Born and brought up in a cosmopolitan city like Calcutta, I have spent almost twelve years of my life in the remote villages of West Bengal adjacent to India-Bangladesh border. Throughout this journey, I have genuinely felt that the fine threads of our social fabric are being destroyed bit by bit every day by discriminatory politics. Not just in our country, but this is also the reality that happened everywhere. Looking around us, we can see the entire world plagued by the menace of religious polarisation. An individual from one community casts aspersions on individuals of other communities when the religious identity of a human being turns out to be their sole identity. Our story tries to capture this very narrative through the innocent eyes of two little boys. In these tough times, our only hope is to try and be "humans" first. *Two Friends (Dostojee)* is my expression of love and respect for humanity and my silent protest against communal polarisation.

Prasun Chatterjee was born in suburban Calcutta. His family immigrated to India from Bangladesh due to the communal tensions after the India-Pakistan partition. Without any experience of filmmaking, he managed to shoot his first short film, *Shades*, in 2017, which was selected in numerous film festivals. With a Bohemian soul, he has spent time wandering near the India-Bangladesh border in search of meaning. He has experienced the lives of the villagers, their emotions, economy, communal polarisation, and innocence very closely. All these experiences manifested in his mind as the story behind *Two Friends (Dostojee)*, which becomes his first feature film.
