A small Sri Lankan fishing village skyrocketed to fame as an international kitesurfing hotspot. We follow the journeys of its two co-existing worlds: kitesurfing and fishing.

SYNOPSIS

Between the Hooks tells the story of a small Sri Lankan fishing village that skyrocketed to fame as an international kitesurfing hotspot, revealing stories from its two co-existing worlds: kitesurfing and fishing.

Dilsiri, a local kitesurfing enthusiast and entrepreneur, is trying to maintain a sustainable tourism model. But in the absence of any governing regulations, the village is overcrowding with international investors, thus endangering his model. Dilsiri is torn between fighting the ever-changing authorities and mediating disagreements between the kitesurfing schools and the fishing society.

Emmanuel's family, which heads the fishing society, is split between generations—a changeaverse grandfather, an accommodating father and a rebellious kitesurfing son.

Supported by his father, Sachin has carved a new path for himself as a kitesurfing coach, to his grandfather's disapproval. While COVID-19 never stopped Dilsiri from his battle, Sachin is forced to give up his dreams and learn his family tradition.

From astonishing shots of the modern kitesurfing world to calming sceneries of traditional fishing, the film navigates the story of how one village's harmony becomes endangered. How can one lagoon be the home to such a diverse range of interests?

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

I was raised to pursue a traditional career as a professor in pharmaceutics. I took many steps towards reaching my family's goal. However, I knew my passion lay elsewhere. The first time I picked up a camera at the age of 21, I quickly changed track to pursue a career in film. It was unacceptable to my family initially, but they gradually started to be proud of me.

I first went to Kalpitiya as a kitesurfer, and there I met Dilsiri. We instantly connected over the similarities in the journeys we'd taken to pursue our passions. I was especially taken by his desire to rebuild and give back to his community. Later, I was introduced to Sachin, whom reminded me of the time when I wanted to leave pharmaceutics. Because of his dedication, I wanted to follow him as he carved himself a path while respecting his family's traditions. After spending some time in the village of Kudawa, I was surprised to discover how much we have in common, though we came from what appeared to be different cultures. Connecting with the villagers made me, without a doubt, ready to spend a few years telling their story.
