ONE-SENTENCE SYNOPSIS

Once married to the same man, two women in their seventies must forget the past and work together to look after an empty, snowbound village for the whole winter.

SYNOPSIS

Thuli and Kalima are of the same age, they have always lived in Dhor, and they even shared a husband. This is where similarities end. The childless Thuli drinks and sings in memory of their husband, and wishes she too were dead. Kalima has a daughter, whom she calls for support, and looks forward to better days. Snowed-in and isolated, the women are tasked to take care of 200 houses left behind by villagers who have moved south to escape the winter. When off-duty, they interpret each other's dreams, and pray for good health or a painless death.

Sometimes they have encounters with people who live in the far corners of the valley. Sometimes passers-by bring news of deaths and funerals. During the worst snowfall, Thuli's sickness reaches a critical point. At the same time, Kalima hears of road accidents while her daughter is travelling to India. The women neglect their guard duty and houses get robbed. In spring, the villagers come back to Dhor. Now Thuli and Kalima will find out if they will have to pay fines for losses.

Next winter, as they get older and weaker, they will probably go through the same ordeal again.

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

As filmmakers, we are interested in stories about people and the meaning of their existence in society. Life in Nepal today is defined by poverty, gender roles, remoteness, urban-rural divide, caste and "untouchability".

All these manifest in the lives of Thuli and Kalima. Society considers them "low caste" and "untouchable". They have little material wealth, and their identities are still tied to their common, but already dead, husband. To outsiders, it is as if they are doomed to isolation and drudgery. Yet, upon close observation, we find their lives a quiet, pastoral dignity, and a sense of freedom in contrast to city-dwellers. Their activities and experiences also defy our preconceived ideas about rural women and the relationships they have in life.

In fact, Thuli and Kalima resemble many of our family members closely. Both of us have family members who refuse to leave village life – which we find tough and unrewarding – and settle with us in the city. While we have finished shooting 85% of the film, our shooting schedule has been pushed back by the pandemic. Through HAF, we aim to raise funds to help us complete shooting.

A Nepalese filmmaker working in both fiction and documentary, Kathet is a DocNomads and Berlinale Talents alumnus. His first short documentary was *Split Ends* (2016). His latest

short *Bare Trees in The Mist* (2019) premiered at Toronto International Film Festival 2019, and was also screened at Tampere Film Festival, Hong Kong International Film Festival, Short Shorts Film Festival & Asia, Encounters Film Festival, etc.
