

The 21st Hong Kong - Asia Film Financing Forum (HAF) Brief Report

The **21**st **Hong Kong - Asia Film Financing Forum** (HAF) was held as a physical, in-person event supplementary with online meetings for the first time since 2019 from 13 - 15 March at the Hong Kong Convention & Exhibition Centre in conjunction with the 27th Hong Kong Film & TV Market (FILMART).

The forum was organised by the **Hong Kong International Film Festival Society** (HKIFFS), co-organised by the **Hong Kong Trade Development Council** (HKTDC), and financially supported by **Create Hong Kong** (CreateHK) and **Film Development Fund** (FDF). Held concurrently with **Hong Kong International Film and TV Market** (FILMART) for the sixteenth time, HAF was once again one of the core events of Entertainment Expo Hong Kong.

HAF is widely recognised as one of the most significant film-financing platforms in Asia. Over the three-day period, HAF attracted leading film financers, producers, distributors and buyers, connecting them with talented filmmakers through business meetings and seminar, pitching and networking events for potential co-production opportunities.

This year marked the 7th edition of "Work-in-Progress" Open Pitch and resumed the physical format. Filmmakers from the shortlisted 15 feature fiction projects were invited to present their projects on the stage at the Starlight Theatre on 13 March, 2023. The aim of the open pitch is

to promote the selected film projects and connect the talented filmmakers with professionals and investors, post-production companies, distribution agents and film festival programmers. The target audiences are the film industry professionals attending FILMART and HAF. 561 guests are recorded from various countries. Private meetings with the attendees were also arranged potential collaboration.
