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HKIFFS UNVEILS 26 IN-DEVELOPMENT HAF PROJECTS



Hong Kong, 18 January 2024 – The Hong Kong International Film Festival Society (HKIFFS) has announced 26 in-development projects shortlisted for the 22nd Hong Kong - Asia Film Financing Forum (HAF), scheduled to take place from 11 to 13 March 2024, in conjunction with the Hong Kong FILMART.

These in-development projects (IDP) cover many genres, from comedy and horror to action, romance, family drama, and animation, carefully chosen from 256 submissions from 37 countries and regions.

"We are delighted to present a diverse array of projects, including seven feature directorial debuts, two animations, and a spate of collaborative endeavours across multiple countries," expressed Jacob Wong, the HKIFF Industry Director. "The selection is a testament to the resurgence of diversity and the revitalisation of international collaborations."

This year's three-day HAF will be an integral part of a newly expanded HKIFF Industry Project Market alongside the inaugural HKIFF Industry - CAA China Genre Initiative (HCG), which aims to support the development of Chinese language genre films.

"As the world gradually returns to normality, we eagerly embrace the opportunities ahead. One of our first efforts is to evolve HAF into a more complete and multi-faceted project market," Wong said.

HKIFFS will announce the shortlisted projects for HCG and HAF's Works-in-Progress initiative by early February.





Some of this year's IDP highlights are: -

New Directors, Acclaimed Producers

More emerging directors are bringing their feature projects to HAF under the watchful eyes and support of acclaimed and experienced producers. This year's line-up includes:

- Wang Xiaoshuai (*So Long, My Son*) will produce Zhang Yushan's *About Her Hidden Life*: a young woman with an unhappy history tries to start her life anew.
- Peter Yam (*The Sunny Side of the Street*) and Michael J. Werner (*Suk Suk*) will produce Shreyom Ghosh's horror comedy *The Vampire of Sheung Shui*: a slacker turns into a bloodthirsty vampire.
- Yamamoto Teruhisa (*Drive My Car*) will produce Sakamoto Yukari's teen drama *White Flowers* and *Fruits:* Mean Girls in a Christian girls' boarding school.
- Zhang Lu (*The Shadowless Tower*) will produce Zhang Yu's *Tephra*: a triptych of two men, one woman and a couple of volcanoes. Zhang Yu's *Killing the Violet* won an award at last year's Pingyao IFF.
- Fukase Kazumi (*Key of Life, Japanese Girls Never Die*) will produce Sakashita Yuichiro's *Blonde*: Teacher Ichikawa has a problem: all his high school pupils have dyed their hair blonde.

Winners Return with New Projects

After making a mark with their first and second features, several up-and-coming directors return to HAF with their new projects:

- *Camellia Girl* by Josh Kim (*How to Win at Checkers (Every Time*), premiered at Berlin) and produced by Douglas Seok (*Minari*): two Korean American sisters return to rural Texas for their father's funeral. Trouble in paradise!
- *Naga Swim Upstream* by Patiparn Boontarig (*Solids by the Seashore*, 2023 Busan New Currents winner): a woman returns home to Chiang Rai and recovers her mythical Naga lineage.
- The Sichuan Culinary Chronicles: In Four Chapters by Qiu Jiongjiong (A New Old Play, Special Jury Prize at Locarno) is a dark and comedic culinary guide to Sichuan cuisine in four chapters and many colours.

International Co-productions

- *The Echo of the Leopard* marks the first Iran-Ukraine project for HAF. Directed by Hanna Jalali and Moeinoddin Jalali, this Iran-set crime drama is about an ageing father who unwittingly reveals his criminal past and throws his son's life into disarray.
- Hong Kong-USA co-production *Encore* by Stefanos Tai (*We Don't Dance for Nothing*) follows a man playing along when his ailing grandma mistakes him for her long-lost lover.
- *Nagi Notes* by Fukada Koji (*Love Life*), a Japan-France co-production, is a portrait of the friendship between a Tokyo architect and two high school boys whom she meets visiting her sculptor friend in a mountain village.





• **Staring at Your Back** by Jang Kun-Jae (*Because I Hate Korea*, 2023 Busan IFF Opening Film), a Japanese high school boy harbours a deep affection for his childhood friend, a Korean boy - also a Korea-Japan co-production.

Animated Features

Added to the mix are two animated features:

- **The Excreman On the Road** by Brian Tse (Hong Kong's McDull animated feature series) is a poop story about Excreman, a humanised dung character who lives in the sewers.
- Hana Zhang's debut, *Pet Paradise*, is a stop-motion feature animation about a pig-faced girl battling the eerie world of plastic surgery.

HAF Film Lab Titles

This year's IDP shortlist includes five projects developed by the HAF Film Lab. They are:

- *A Ghost in the Market* by Chin Chia-Hua (*Trouble Girl*): a woman, beaten to death by her husband, continues to run her market stall.
- *Sink City* by Hou Dasheng (*Hani,* in post-production): rival student groups rehearse "Thunderstorm", a classic Chinese spoken drama, in an old mining town.
- Emetjan Memet's wry comedy and character study *Good Drink Pub*: a Xinjiang tavern boss falls in love with a new waitress.
- Yeung Leung-chuen's *The Playwright's Stories*: a young man goes to study drama in Taiwan while his girlfriend stays in Hong Kong.
- Yu Haiyang's thriller *Wake Me Up*: a Korean-Chinese mother reconnecting with the son she left behind in China, only to find out that he may be a murderer.
