## INAUGURAL HKIFF INDUSTRY - CAA CHINA GENRE INITIATIVE ANNOUNCES SIX GENRE PROJECTS



**Hong Kong, 25 January 2024** – The Hong Kong International Film Festival Society (HKIFFS) has revealed six genre projects for the inaugural HCG, a new collaboration between HKIFFS and talent agency CAA China.

HCG, which stands for *HKIFF Industry - CAA China Genre Initiative*, was launched in August last year to support and facilitate the growth and progress of Chinese-language genre projects. The first edition of HCG will coincide with the 22<sup>nd</sup> Hong Kong - Asia Film Financing Forum (HAF) and will be held from 11 to 13 March 2024, concurrent with the 28<sup>th</sup> Hong Kong International Film & TV Market (FILMART). HCG and HAF will both be part of the expanded HKIFF Industry Project Market.

Under HCG, two projects will be chosen to receive a cash prize of US\$20,000 each as part of their development funding. Furthermore, the winning projects will benefit from bespoke guidance from script mentors. CAA China can engage in script development agreements with the selected projects.

CAA China is a world-class media and entertainment company, formed by leading entertainment and sports agency Creative Artists Agency (CAA), in partnership with CMC Capital Partners (CMC).

The inaugural HGC will showcase an equal number of experienced filmmakers and those making their debut. They are:

• *Call of Lobster*, directed by Yin Chen-Hao and produced by Cheng Wei-Hao and Jin Pai-Lunn (all known for their involvement in Taiwan's box office hit *Man in Love*), draws inspiration



from a true and extraordinary story. The comedy-drama follows a lobster farmer's overseas journey to share his unique lobster farming techniques.

- **Dying Fire** is a suspenseful comedy-drama directed by Gao Linyang (winner in Rotterdam with *To Love Again*) and produced by Guan Hu (*The Eight Hundred*). The plot revolves around a miner and an accountant who plan to retrieve their stolen money by setting up a fake bank they intend to rob.
- *Hyperinflation*, directed by Yan Bing (known for *160 Years Old*) and produced by Li Xiaoyuan and Shan Zuolong (both associated with *The Water Murmurs*, winner of the Short Film Palme d'Or at Cannes), is a gripping drama. It centres around an archaeologist who struggles with the financial debts left behind by her missing husband while simultaneously unravelling the mystery surrounding an ancient female corpse.
- *Countdown to the End* by Wang Hao (known for his award-winning short film *Brad Lee*) is an action-packed suspense drama. The story follows a shopping mall security guard who engages in a thrilling cat-and-mouse game with a mysterious caller, all in a race against time to save innocent lives and seek redemption.
- *Reunion Diaries* is directed by first-time feature director Rowena Loh and produced by Jean Yeo (from the *Last Madame: Sisters of the Night* series) and Taiwanese actor James Wen. This Lunar New Year rom-com traverses New York, Singapore, Taipei, and Hong Kong, showcasing love's highs and lows.
- *Scriptures and Poetry* is by director Du Junlin (previously an editor) and producer Li Xiaoyuan. This comedy revolves around an elderly film director who embarks on a journey with his elderly scriptwriter, seeking inspiration for a romance film.
