The 22nd Hong Kong - Asia Film Financing Forum (HAF) Brief Report

The 22nd Hong Kong - Asia Film Financing Forum (HAF) was held as a physical, in-person event supplementary with online meetings for the first time since 2019 from 13 - 15 March 2024 at the Hong Kong Convention & Exhibition Centre in conjunction with the 27th Hong Kong Film & TV Market (FILMART).

The forum was organised by the **Hong Kong International Film Festival Society** (HKIFFS), coorganised by the **Hong Kong Trade Development Council** (HKTDC), and financially supported by **Create Hong Kong** (CreateHK) and **Film Development Fund** (FDF). Held concurrently with **Hong Kong International Film and TV Market** (FILMART) for the sixteenth time, HAF was once again one of the core events of Entertainment Expo Hong Kong.

HAF is widely recognised as one of the most significant film-financing platforms in Asia. Over the three-day period, HAF attracted leading film financers, producers, distributors and buyers, connecting them with talented filmmakers through business meetings and seminar, pitching and networking events for potential co-production opportunities.

This year marked the 8th edition of "Work-in-Progress" Open Pitch, a program aims to promote the selected film projects and connect the talented filmmakers with professionals and investors, post-production companies, distribution agents and film festival programmers. The target audiences are the film industry professionals attending FILMART and HAF. Filmmakers from the shortlisted 15 feature fiction projects were invited to present their projects on the stage at the Moonlight Theatre on 11 and 12 March 2024. 637 guests are recorded from various countries. Private meetings with the attendees were also arranged potential collaboration.

The 15 shortlisted WIP projects are mainly from Hong Kong and Asian countries or regions. There are 5 feature debuts, 4 non-Chinese language projects and 3 international co-production films. They are Quentin Hsu Kun-Hua 's *Admission*, Shen Ko-Shang's *Deep Quiet Room*, Janus Victoria's *Diamonds in the Sand*, Zhang Hanyi's *Elapse*, Zhang Zhongyu's *Green Persimmon*, Upamanyu Bhattacharyya's *Heirloom*, Chang Tso-Chi's *Intimate Encounter*, Lav Diaz 's *Kawalan*, Zhang Zhongchen's *Nighttime Sounds*, Oliver Chan Siu-kuen's *Montages of a Modern Motherhood*, Mark Gill's *Ravens*, Jiang Xiaoxuan's *To Kill a Mongolian Horse*, Adam Wong Sau-ping's *The Walk We Talk*.
