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# HKIFF INDUSTRY ADDS 15 HAF WIP PROJECTS TO ITS EXPANDED PROJECT MARKET



**Hong Kong, 1 February 2024** – The Hong Kong International Film Festival Society (HKIFFS) completes the bumper line-up of the newly expanded HKIFF Industry Project Market by adding 15 works-in-progress to the 22<sup>nd</sup> Hong Kong - Asia Film Financing Forum (HAF).

Earlier, HKIFFS announced 26 HAF in-development projects and six projects for the inaugural HKIFF Industry - CAA China Genre Initiative. The 47-project HKIFF Industry Project Market will run from 11 to 13 March 2024 alongside the 28<sup>th</sup> Hong Kong International Film & TV Market (FILMART).

The 15 shortlisted WIP projects include works by such notable filmmakers as Chang Tso-Chi, Lav Diaz, Mark Gill, Midi Z, Tan Chui Mui, and Yang Chao and feature a host of prominent and emerging actors, including Asano Tadanobu, Ikematsu Sosuke, Joseph Chang, Ariel Lin, Lo Chun Yip, Nai An, Hedwig Tam, Wang Hongwei, and Neo Yau.

The highlights include: -

### **Unveiling Life's Tapestry**

Stories told from children's perspectives tend to stand out and tug the heartstrings.

• **The Land is Our Navel**, directed by Zhang Zhongchen (*The White Cow*) and produced by Midi Z (director of *Nina Wu*), embarks on the surreal journey of a six-year-old girl who travels with a mysterious boy ghost and discovers her village's tragic past.



• Through the viewpoint of a 10-year-old boy and spanning four seasons, *The Wind is Unstoppable* by Huo Meng (*Crossing the Border - Zhaoguan*) examines an extended family who lived in a small town just before the massive rural-urban migration started in the early 1990s.

Family dramas unfold the peaks and valleys of life, exploring many layers of relationships.

- **Deep Quiet Room** by Shen Ko-Shang (documentary *LOVE Talk*) centres on a devastated man who unravels the painful truth of his pregnant wife's family that leads to her suicide. The cast includes Ariel Lin and Joseph Chang.
- *Heirloom* marks the first animated feature of director Upamanyu Bhattacharyya (codirector of award-winning animated short *Wade*). This period family drama is set in Ahmedabad and is about a couple who run a handloom business and encounter a magical tapestry that immortalises their family history.
- *Intimate Encounter* by Chang Tso-Chi (*Thanatos, Drunk*) follows a young man who goes back to live with his grandfather during the COVID-19 pandemic, but his life is falling apart faster than he can cope.
- *Elapse* by Zhang Hanyi (*Life After Life*, winner of HKIFF Firebird Award) is about a woman who returns home to re-establish a new family order through bird hunting. This project previously attended both the HAF Film Lab and HAF IDP programmes.

Being a new mother is one of the most challenging jobs, while extreme parenthood can be daunting.

- *Montages of a Modern Motherhood*, the second feature by Oliver Chan (*Still Human*), is about a new mother suffering from baby blues who needs an immediate way out at all costs. Hedwig Tam and Lo Chun Yip head the cast.
- Quentin Hsu's feature debut, *Admission*, centres on a couple determined to find the snitch who sabotages their six-year-old child's admission to an elite school.

### Love Transcends All Boundaries

Love comes in all shapes and forms and is not always sweet.

- Starring Asano Tadanobu, *Ravens* by Mark Gill (*England is Mine*) offers an intimate insight into the tumultuous relationship between iconic Japanese photographer Fukase Masahisa and his muse, Wanibe Yoko.
- **Yongle Palace**, directed by Nan Xin (*Go Photo Shooting*) and produced by Yang Chao (director of *Crosscurrent*), is an oddball comedy about a man who reluctantly helps his childhood friend-cum-creditor date an internet celebrity.

People isolated and marginalised by society try to blend into the "normal" world.

- Zhang Zhongyu's feature debut, *Green Persimmon*, is a bleak drama about a former inmate and an emotionally broken woman who find solace in each other before reality hits.
- Jiang Xiaoxuan's feature debut, *To Kill a Mongolian Horse*, produced by Tan Chui Mui (director of *Barbarian Invasion*), is inspired by the true story of a herdsman whose dual life as a horseback performer runs parallel to the disintegration of the traditional way of life.



• **The Way We Talk** by Adam Wong (*The Way We Dance*) revolves around three deaf young people who strive to unlock life's potential while embracing the sound of silence. Neo Yau stars.

## **Established Director and Producer Join the Shortlist**

- *Kawalan* by Lav Diaz (*The Woman Who Left,* Venice's Golden Lion winner) is a human drama about a local community that struggles to move to the deep jungle to avoid the invading Japanese during World War II.
- **Diamonds in the Sand**, the narrative feature debut by documentary filmmaker Janus Victoria, follows an ageing Japanese salaryman as he travels to Manila to escape dying alone and unnoticed. Lorna Tee (*Mrs K*) and Dan Villegas (*Fan Girl*) produce this Philippines-Japan-Malaysia co-production.

### **Open Pitch Session**

All shortlisted WIP projects will participate in an open pitch session at the Hong Kong Convention and Exhibition Centre on 11 and 12 March 2024. Representatives of each project will present their projects and showcase footage of their works in progress. All HKIFF Industry Project Market and FILMART badge holders are welcome to participate.

- *Guras* by Saurav Rai won the jury prize in the Proxima Competition at Karlovy Vary International Film Festival.
- **Stonewalling** by Huang Ji and Ryuji Otsuka won Best Film and Best Film Editing at the 60<sup>th</sup> Taipei Golden Horse Awards.
- *Fly Me to the Moon* by Sasha Chuk won Best New Performer at the 60<sup>th</sup> Taipei Golden Horse Awards.
- The Busan International Film Festival showcased eight HAF projects, including *Solids by the Seashore* by Patiparn Boontarig, winner of the New Currents Award; *Salli* by Lien Chien-Hung; and *The Spark* by Rajesh S. Jala.
