The Hong Kong - Asia Film Financing Forum Announces Operation Greenlight Projects and Additional Award Sponsors

HONG KONG, 4 March 2019 – The 17th Hong Kong - Asia Film Financing Forum (HAF) today unveiled four projects shortlisted for this year's **Operation Greenlight**, which will take place on 20 March 2019 at the Hong Kong Convention and Exhibition Centre.

Concurrently, HAF is pleased to confirm four more awards for this year, including three new ones, bringing the number of award categories to 15, with a combined value of HK\$2,100,000 (approx. US\$267,000) in cash and in kind.

Now in its 5th edition, Operation Greenlight is an initiative by Create Hong Kong (CreateHK) and the Film Development Council (FDC), in conjunction with the Hong Kong International Film Festival Society (HKIFFS) and HAF, to help talented young Hong Kong filmmakers to realize their projects.

Four projects selected from CreateHK and FDC's First Feature Film Initiative will be presented during HAF in an open pitch session to an audience of industry professionals, including sales agents, distributors, producers, financiers, and festival programmers.

These young filmmakers will be offered advance advice and guidance by industry mentors on how to polish their presentations, and a dedicated Operation Greenlight team will assist them to schedule meetings with interested parties afterwards.

"Operation Greenlight is an important platform for emerging filmmakers to present their works to established industry professionals," said Mr. Wellington FUNG, FDC Secretary-General. "Hong Kong has a long history of developing young local talent, many of whom have become internationally recognized filmmakers."

This year's shortlisted Operation Greenlight projects include:

- A Pele Da Flor: Director CHOI Po-yu draws from her own experience of battling depression in this drama about Hannah, a suicidal young woman, who befriends an older tattoo artist. "When I got my first tattoo, I went for a sun tattoo on my arm," CHOI says. "It is the proof of my victory over depression in 2015. Hannah's story, to a certain extent, is a reflection of my life." Norman CHAN will produce this HK\$6.5 million (approx. US\$830,000) project.
- Unclaimed: A story of forgiveness from director Steve LAW about a troubled journalist, Kuen, who is determined to learn the identity and life story of a man found dead in the sea. Immersing himself in the dead man's story, Kuen eventually is able to get his life back on track. Film veterans CHAN Hing-kai and O Sing-pui will co-produce this HK\$10 million (approx. \$1.28 million) mystery-drama.
- 3. *Just for Lease*: Director **Yorkie KAM**'s thriller is set in a coffin home a common living environment in Hong Kong where people are cramped into a tiny space. There, a group of

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outcasts share the home in search of love and life, but at a cost too high to bear. Catherine KWAN serves as producer on the HK\$8 million (approx. US\$1 million) project.

4. *Leaves Fall in Spring*: **Riley LEUNG** directs this HK\$6 million (approx. US\$750,000) drama about a young taxi driver who spends the best years of his life looking for his roots, while missing out on life's many other opportunities, including love. The fear of losing prevents him from longing for anything meaningful. Dan IP produces.

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New HAF Awards and Returning Sponsor

HAF is pleased to announce three more new awards this year. The **WIP Documentary Award**, presented by **CreateHK, FDC and HAF**, is to encourage and promote the development of documentaries. All WIP documentary projects are eligible to compete for the cash award, which has a value of HK\$78,000 (approx. US\$10,000).

The **KOFIC Award**, with a cash prize of HK\$100,000 (approx. US\$12,800), is presented by **the Korean Film Council (KOFIC)**, which is committed to the growth of the Asian film industry. The award is to recognize the outstanding potential of an Asian film project for its development.

The **Cinerent Award**, presented by **Cinerent Beijing Ltd.**, aims to support and encourage highquality film projects. All HAF projects are eligible to compete for this award, with a value of RMB150,000 (approx. HK\$175,000). The winning project is required to shoot in Mainland China in order to entitle the benefits.

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HAF also welcomes returning sponsor **Wanda Media** with the **Wanda Elite+ Plan Award**, with a cash value of HK\$100,000 (approx. US\$12,800). It is dedicated to discovering and cultivating new film talents for the Chinese film market with the advantages of Wanda's integrated industry chain.

The Hong Kong - Asia Film Financing Forum (HAF) is widely recognized as an established film financing platform in Asia. HAF brings Asian filmmakers with upcoming film projects to Hong Kong for co-production ventures with top film financiers, producers, bankers, distributors and buyers. Attracting more than 1,000 filmmakers and financiers from at least 35 countries and regions, around 25 to 30 projects are selected annually to participate in the three-day event. HAF has the added advantage of being held in conjunction with Hong Kong Filmart, Asia's largest film market which attracts over 8,000 professionals.

HAF has partnered with international organisations to provide a range of opportunities to participants. Partners include iQIYI (China), Fox International Productions (Greater China) (US), Cinemart (the Netherlands), Asian Project Market (South Korea), Golden Horse Film Project Promotion (Taiwan), New Cinema Network (Italy) and others.
