ONE-SENTENCE SYNOPSIS

Mieko remembers her former best friend Tsumugi, who was her escape from repressive school life when she was ten. A certain incident tore them apart.

SYNOPSIS

On her way home from work, Mieko sees a girl bawling in the dark, and the girl's friend sitting by her side. The encounter reminds her of a best friend that she once had, someone whom she will never see again.

Mieko, who adored her always-working mother and never wanted friends, and Tsumugi, who could not break free from her strict mother and was loved by everyone, were best friends from the age of ten to twelve. However, due to their immaturity, the girls begin to act in strange ways. This is a story about two sad girls who grow apart and never speak to each other again after one tragic incident.

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

I want to shoot a film about children and their definition of friendship, what it means to grow up, and how unstable children can be, not having the knowledge of what is wrong and what is right.
