ONE-SENTENCE SYNOPSIS

A Hong Kong taxi driver takes a refugee boy on the road to escape pursuit by the driver's policeman son.

SYNOPSIS

Yat is a taxi driver living in Hong Kong who despises the settlement of refugees in his neighbourhood. His policeman son, Hong, tries to encourage tolerance. One day while on the road, Yat accidentally kills a refugee driver. Hong spares his father from prosecution by amending the witness statements. Yat, disturbed by guilt, decides to seek out the family of the deceased and finds the son, Hassan. Hassan has been drifting around Sham Shui Po and is used by triads for gang fights against the police. Hong, while pursuing Hassan on duty, accidentally kills his superior and tries to frame Hassan with the killing. Yat, who witnessed the whole incident, persuades Hassan to flee to mainland China. Yat and Hassan build a special relationship on the road. Moments before boarding the smuggler's boat, Hassan learns that Yat is his father's killer.

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

The Sunny Side of the Street is my first feature and the product of my recent observations. While working on documentaries on stateless boat people in Malaysia and refugees in Hong Kong, my biggest challenge has been dealing with the proposition that the refugees choose their own fate — where, in fact, they have no choices. They are pushed about by the forces of the times, drifting from one place to another. Their children grow up in tumult. I want to make a film about a refugee and a Hong Kong local, where the refugee ultimately does make his own choice.

Lau Kok Rui is a Hong Kong-based Malaysian writer-director who graduated from the 11th Golden Horse Film Academy. His directorial works include fiction, documentary and TV drama; *Let's Get Lost* (2017), *Have A Nice Day* (2018), *How High the Moon* (2019), were selected by numerous film festivals, such as the Asian American International Film Festival (USA) and the Fresh Wave International Short Film Festival (Hong Kong). He is currently developing his first feature film, *The Sunny Side of the Street*, which won the Script Service Award in Film Lab of Hong Kong - Asia Film Financing Forum.
